

Dear Sir Reijnen,

Thank you for your letter of May 12<sup>th</sup> 2026 addressed to OLAF.

The mission of the European Anti-Fraud Office (OLAF) is to detect, investigate and support the fight against fraud affecting the EU budget.

This includes:

- all EU expenditure (structural funds, agricultural policy and rural development funds, direct expenditure and external aid, etc.);
- some areas of EU revenue (mainly customs duties).

In addition, OLAF is also competent to investigate suspicions of serious misconduct by Members of EU Institutions, EU staff and members and staff of other EU bodies, independently of whether they affect the EU budget or not.

Please note that OLAF cannot investigate allegations of:

- fraud with no financial impact on EU public funds;
- corruption which does not involve Members or staff of the EU Institutions and bodies.

In order to treat your request we would need further details (e.g. information on the name or reference number of the EU project or grant you are referring to, on the scheme or on the persons involved). Without any such information OLAF will not be able to examine your allegation any further.
